

ENTER THE FAUN To Premiere on AMERICA REFRAMED A film by Tamar Rogoff and Daisy Wright

February 17, 2017 – (New York, NY) – Tamar Rogoff and Daisy Wright's documentary, **ENTER THE FAUN**, will have its U.S. television premiere **Tuesday**, **March 28, 2017** at **8 p.m.** on WORLD Channel (check local listings), as part of the new season of public media's **AMERICA REFRAMED**. The documentary series is dedicated to highlighting intimate stories by emerging and veteran filmmakers who are chronicling an ever-changing America. P: 212-989-8121 F: 212-989-8230 americareframed.com **ENTER THE FAUN** is the culmination of an intensive two-year collaboration between a veteran choreographer, Tamar Rogoff, and a young actor with cerebral palsy, Gregg Mozgala. As a choreographer, Tamar had always been interested in exploring the body, with non-dancers as well as dancers. Fascinated by Gregg's unique physicality, she was inspired to choreograph "Diagnosis of a Faun." Their creative exploration, at the intersection of science and art, led them to discover that his diagnosis and physical limitations were not necessarily fixed and immutable.

Trained as a dancer and the daughter of a medical doctor, Tamar was surrounded by science but lacked formal medical training. Her keen knowledge of anatomy and movement, however, led her on a path to explore the body's intelligence. She wondered if re-educating Gregg's nervous system was possible.

Because of his cerebral palsy, Gregg faced life in a wheelchair at age 40. While he had no muscular disfigurement, he experienced pain, physical tension and mental anguish, which kept his body out of balance. Gregg was always concerned about his walking—in relation to others and, after working with Tamar, in relation to himself. Tamar employed a combination of techniques and practices to help address Gregg's fears in a nurturing way. She wondered if through dance she could help create alternate neuro-pathways.

Challenging the boundaries of medicine and art, as well as the limitations associated



with disability, Tamar and Gregg opened the door to new and endless possibilities. His transformation was so radical that even before Tamar could understand its ramifications, she knew she needed to document it and share it. Intrigued by Tamar's exploration, renowned neurologist Oliver Sacks came to see them work. In addition to the film, their work has been featured in the Kennedy Krieger Institute at John Hopkins University, the Wyss Institute for Biologically Inspired Engineering at Harvard University, the New York Times and the Journal of Bodywork and Movement Therapies.
