

# CARE A film by Deirdre Fishel

## TV Broadcast Premiere on AMERICA REFRAMED Tuesday, September 5, 2017 at 8 p.m. on WORLD Channel

July 11, 2017 – (New York, NY) – Even though we don't want to think about it, if we're lucky enough to live a long life, we'll need help. Ninety percent of Americans want to age at home, but with families spread apart and adult relatives working long hours, who will provide the care?

**CARE**, the acclaimed feature documentary by Deirdre Fishel and Tony Heriza, pulls back the curtain on the largely unseen world of paid home care. With a verité eye, it follows the stories of care workers and their clients. **CARE** will have its national television broadcast premiere on <u>AMERICA REFRAMED</u> on Tuesday, September 5, 2017, at **8 p.m.** on WORLD Channel (check local listings). The documentary series is dedicated to highlighting intimate stories by emerging and veteran filmmakers who are chronicling an ever-changing America.

The broadcast premiere will be followed by free streaming for audiences across the U.S. at <a href="https://www.worldchannel.org/americareframed">www.worldchannel.org/americareframed</a> starting on September 6<sup>th</sup>.

In the film, we meet undocumented-careworker Vilma and her 93-year old client, Dee. We go to work with Laurie, mother of 5, who tends to wheelchair-bound Larry in a rural Pennsylvania town. In Manhattan, we meet Toni and her husband, Peter, who suffers from severe Parkinson's.

Through these personal stories *CARE* depicts the social importance of home-based care and exposes a broken system, where workers make poverty wages and elders and their families struggle to pay for the care they need. The film also reveals the

beginning of a movement to improve how we care—both for the growing number of older adults and for those who make their lives livable.

"As I began to investigate the world of paid home care," said director Deirdre Fishel, "I was shocked by what I found; a largely unregulated system, confusing to navigate and totally uncovered by Medicare. With our elder population soaring, I assumed someone had to be making a film about this, but when I realized they weren't, I started right away. This issue needs to be on the public agenda. Our country will soon be facing a tsunami of need and we're totally unprepared for it."

From 2005-2015, the 65 and over population increased by 30% to 47.8 million; it is expected to double to 98 million in 2060. The 85+ population is expected to triple from 6.7 million in 2015 to 14.6 million in 2040. (Source: Forbes.com)
