To answer Jen's request: Since 2000 I had the privilege of inviting women in the prison nursery at Bedford to participate in research. I was funded by various sources as a professor at Columbia U. First I did ethnography -- that means we viewed the nursery as a community -- then descriptions of women themselves and infants, and from 2003 we followed 97 women with 100 infants for all time on nursery and first year out. This is the first longitudinal study ever done for prison nursery. For that and following studies I had NIH support -- very credible. And I had a team! Including Bobby! Then we were able to find more than half of these women and children and followed them in community thru at least child's 8th birthday. Mary
