P: 212-989-8121 F: 212-989-8230 americareframed.com Feb. 2, 2018 – (New York, NY) – **THE INVISIBLE PATIENTS** sheds light on some of the most urgent healthcare issues facing our nation today: from the living conditions of the elderly, poor, and end-of-life care, to the complexity of insurance and overprescription of opiates.

THE INVISIBLE PATIENTS, the feature documentary by Patrick O'Connor, will make its national TV broadcast premiere on Tuesday, March 20, 2018, at 8 p.m. on WORLD Channel (check local listings) as part of the new season of AMERICA REFRAMED, public media's award- winning documentary series. Streaming will begin on March 21, 2018 on worldchannel.org and all station-branded PBS platforms, including PBS.org, and on PBS apps for iOS, Android, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV and Chromecast.

Jessica Macleod, Ph.D., is a family nurse practitioner who provides primary care to homebound and home-limited patients. With unwavering dedication, she seeks to infuse some common-sense practices into the healthcare system. Researchers estimate that there are approximately five million adults in the U.S. who are homebound or home-limited due to chronic illness or functional limitations.

At the expense of quality time with her own family, Jessica treks back and forth from one homebound patient to another. With her laptop satchel and stethoscope, Jessica makes old-fashioned house calls throughout her workday, typically seeing 8 to 10 patients and driving an average 60 miles throughout her territory in southwestern Indiana and northwestern Kentucky.



"I really just want the audience to see the people I see – how they live, what challenges they face in terms of health, economics, addiction, lack of education," says Jessica Macleod, the nurse practitioner featured in the film. "I want people to know that these invisible patients are here, living among us – they're in our communities, and we need to do more to take care of them."

Often, Jessica's clients are under-resourced. Many face difficult circumstances and exist at the outer edges of our health-care system. Wink and Patty, for example, are an elderly couple dealing with chronic conditions while blackballed by their physician for failing a drug screening; Roger is a 30-year-old man who's bedridden with Duchenne's Muscular Dystrophy; and Ron is a wheelchair-bound man with functional limitations caused by injuries sustained in a motorcycle accident.

Director Patrick O'Connor says, "It was an unforgettable privilege to be allowed into these patients' homes and witness the dignity and grace with which they handled incredibly difficult situations."

Through Jessica's story and those of her patients, the film reveals the emotional and financial toll created by our current system. **THE INVISIBLE PATIENTS** pulls back the curtain on a hidden population and cries out for human-centered solutions. It challenges us to wrestle with healthcare policy and, as importantly, asks us how to care for all persons with dignity and respect.
